6. Rather than bargaining with God by keeping a lot of rules, how does Lewis view the process of Christian morality? How does this line up with Romans 8:5-8?
  
7. What results from the moral choices we make (Rom. 12:1-2; Phil. 1:9-11)?

8. What, for you, is the most important point made in this chapter?

NOTE: The “V.C.” is the Victoria Cross medal: the highest British military decoration, awarded for valor “in the face of the enemy” to members of the armed forces.
